Neo-Nazis Stab Black Man in Claremont

On the night of December 8, 2006, a gang of white nationalists from the IE on their way to a neo-Nazi rally in Westwood randomly attacked two black men in a Claremont shopping plaza. Shouting racist insults at the men, the white gang beat and stabbed one of the victims six times, sending him to the hospital by helicopter. Chad Timothy Milson, 20, of Yucca Valley; Anthony Scott Allen, 23, of Big Bear City; Ryan Christopher White, 28, of Joshua Tree; and Joseph Dale McCool, 20, of Yucca Valley were arrested for the attack the next day at the Westwood rally, a rally much like the one happening in Claremont today. Three of the arrested were sentenced to a total of 31 years in jail.

Police Murder Black Man in Claremont

On the night of January 11, 1999, two Claremont police officers, Hany Hanna and Kent Jacks, stopped a young black man named Irvin Landrum Jr. for a routine traffic stop. The police shot and killed Landrum. Hanna and Jacks originally claimed that Landrum had opened fire on them with a pistol, but the weapon found on the scene had not been fired, had no fingerprints, and was last known to be in the possession of the Ontario police chief. The Claremont community held continuous protests demanding justice for more than a year; the city responded by honoring the cops as city employees of the year. The city eventually paid out \$450,000 in a wrongful death lawsuit in 2003. The police who murdered Landrum were never punished, and their colleagues are here today protecting the neo-Nazis.

SOME RACISTS ARE MORE DANGEROUS THAN OTHERS The National Socialist Movement is an

extreme fringe of violent racism in America. They present a real danger to us that can only be stopped if they and their genocidal ideology cease to exist, but their danger is limited to the hooliganism of a subculture. What truly presents a deadly danger to us is the institutionalized racism of the powerful — of the police who murder black men with impunity, of the Border Patrol that separates immigrant families at the Claremont Greyhound, and of the politicians who force antiimmigrant and anti-union laws on us. The NSM doesn't operate detention camps and do sweeps checking for papers, filling the jails — the state does. As working class people, we need to recognize that the NSM is just the smallest tip of the iceberg when it comes to racist violence. And we need to realize that the only way to stop the violence is to build our own anti-racist power as autonomous communities and organized workplaces so that we can do away with the control of cops, la migra and politicians, and begin the emancipation of our daily life.
