The Mayor and Council have proposed an 11% cut of library staff--the highest percentage of any public service city department. The City Council voted to layoff more than 4,000 city employees is just the beginning.

Only the Library and Recreation & Parks are marked for **additional staff cuts by the hundreds** over the next 5 years.
