We have as our mission the preservation of the separation of church (religion) and state. Rabbi Seidman will challenge us to examine the two faces to religion. One side is within us. It deals with our personal values and how we lead our lives. The other side drives for conformity and dominance in the world. The two aspects are in tension with each other.

He will look at a few bible stories from the book of Numbers, and from the book of First Kings. These stories show the ancient conflicts between those who want to see God as the source of terrestrial authority vs. those who see God in their personal lives not in regulation. Today, this conflict is in the growth of religious movements which support diversity as well as those supporting dominance.
